Pennsylvania Proud - Ed Stanco and Princess of Sylmar

Princess of Sylmar...PA-Bred. Has a nice ring to it, don't you think?

It's certainly music to Ed Stanco's ears.

He's the breeder of Princess, as he calls her, and managing partner of the group that owns her. A 3-year-old chestnut filly with a slim, refined face, she is one of the top racehorses in the country. And she is Pennsylvania through-and-through.

She was born in Pennsylvania - at Sylmar Farm near Christiana in Lancaster County. She started racing in Pennsylvania - at Penn National in Grantville, where

she won her second race by 19 lengths. And her dam Storm Dixie resides in Pennsylvania - at Sylmar Farm — and continues having her babies there, producing more PA-Breds.

All that, Stanco says, is because of

the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund, which offers financial incentives to owners who breed, race and stand their stallions in Pennsylvania.

"It's a great program," Stanco says. "We don't want the politicians to take the money out of it. That's for sure."

If it weren't as lucrative, he says, then he would have shipped Storm Dixie to New York

to give birth to the foal who became Princess of Sylmar. Storm Dixie was Stanco's first broodmare, and her mating with the

Kentucky sire Majestic Warrior was his first attempt at breeding. His subsequent attempts have also produced PA-Breds (usually by Pennsylvania stallions), and he and his partners have continued breaking in their racehorses in Pennsylvania, even though Todd Pletcher, their trainer, usually starts his horses at the premiere tracks.

"The beauty of the Pennsylvania program," says Stanco, CEO of The Toa Reinsurance Company of America, "is that it brings people like us into the game, gives us a fighting chance and lets us have some fun."

As long as the program stays strong, would he consider moving his broodmares out of the state?


"No, absolutely not," he says. "This is the only way I'd do it. I would have them only in Pennsylvania. There'd be no reason to have them any other place."

Stakes-Winning PA-bred Fillies To Test FT November Sales Market

Last seen in eyecatching stakes-winning performances, the Pennsylvania-bred fillies Miss Behaviour and Moon Philly will make their next appearance in the auction ring. Both have been entered in Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's November Sale on November 4.

Miss Behaviour, most recently winner of Belmont Park's Grade 2 Matron Stakes on September 29, is being offered by breeder/owners Cal MacWilliam and Neil Teitelbaum through the consignment of Hill 'N' Dale Sales Agency. The Matron victory was the third in as many starts for the filly from the first Pennsylvania-sired crop of Jump Start, and she boosted her earnings to \$207,000.

The juvenile filly trained by Phil Schoenthal burst on the scene at Parx in July, easily winning a maiden special weight in her debut and attracting the attention of potential buyers. An offer was made, but the deal fell through, to the good fortune of her connections. In her second start, the blaze-

faced filly dominated Monmouth Park's Sorority Stakes (pictured).

MacWilliam and Teitelbaum are thrilled to have the talented filly - currently their only runner - but are willing to see what she may be worth, thus the decision to send her to the elite Kentucky sale. But should



bidding fall short of what they feel she is worth, they will be equally happy to bring her home. The second foal for her stakesplaced dam Successful Romance (by Successful Appeal), Miss Behaviour is from the family of graded winners Twilight Time and Magic Broomstick. A late addition to the sale, she will enter the ring as Hip 209.

Country Life Farm's Malibu Moon filly Moon Philly flew to victory in Delaware Park's Justakiss Stakes on Monday, October 7 to win going away by five and a half lengths. It was the 4-year-old's third stakes win from nine starts this year.

Bred by Ellen Dale Racing LLC, Moon Philly has earned \$325,120 in 20 career starts and has been fourth or better 17 times.

By one of the hottest stallions in the world, she was produced by Astor Place, a daughter of Deputy Minister who decends from Broodmare of the Year Toll Booth, Moon Philly's fourth dam. The family includes 2011 Horse of the Year Havre de Grace, champion Plugged Nickle, leading sire Raja Baba, Grade 1 winners Riskaverse, Christiecat and Sauce Boat, among others.

Consigned by Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services Inc. (John Stuart) for the Country Life Farm partnership which campaigned her, Moon Philly is Hip 105.



FORT LARNED

Trainer Ian Wilkes called an audible when last year's Breeders' Cup Classic-G1 champ Fort Larned lost training time this summer due to a muscle issue while pointing to the Woodward S.-G1. Bypassing the New York route, the big bay son of Northview PA sire E Dubai reappeared in Churchill Downs' Homecoming Classic on Sept. 28, and it was just what the doctor ordered, as he cruised on the front and dug in through the stretch going a mile and an eighth. It's now all systems go for Janis R. Whitham's 5-year-old homebred, who seeks to become only the second horse in Breeders' Cup history to win back-to-back Classics.

WISE DAN

It wasn't the ideal prep for defending Horse of the Year Wise Dan when rain washed the Gr. 1 Shadwell Turf Mile onto the Polytrack on Oct. 5. The chestnut son of Dana Point Farm sire Wiseman's Ferry played catch-up the entire trip but couldn't reel in Silver Max. But the presence of Wise Dan remains daunting as he goes for his second Breeders' Cup Mile-G1. Morton Fink's incredibly consistent homebred - he has been first or second in 14 consecutive graded stakes - remains the one to beat and one of the frontrunners for another Horse of the Year title.

REAL SOLUTION

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's PA-Bred son of champion Kitten's Joy continues to impress since repatriated after his Italian campaign. The Arlington Million-G1 winner was in a heated battle to the wire in his next Grade 1 engagement, the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational S. at Belmont Park, and finished just a length behind winner Little Mike and stablemate Big Blue Kitten. The bay 4-year-old colt, foaled at Glenn and Becky Brok's Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville, desires a distance of ground, and points to the mile and a half Breeders' Cup Turf.

OTHERS

Princess of Sylmar may get her chance in the Distaff as owner/breeder Ed Stanco and trainer Todd Pletcher are thrilled with her training since defeating Royal Delta on Sept. 28 in the Gr. 1 Beldame. Should they reconsider sending her to California, it would be one of the best races of the day. . . Two sons of Northview PA stallions are are working towards the Dirt Mile - Smarty Jones' son Centralinteligence, a Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" winner when taking the Gr. 1 Triple Bend, and Jump Start's millionaire son Pants On Fire, who sizzled in a work at Monmouth Oct. 5. . . And Smarty Jones' Gr. 1-placed juvenile Smarty's Echo appears on the Breeders' Cup contenders list, as one to watch for in the Juvenile.



Winchill Breaks Through in First Responder at Parx

Through their days together of operating Gum Tree Stable in the rural town of Gum Tree, Pa., the husband and wife team of Laura and Larry Ensor has maintained virtual anonymity in the Thoroughbred racing world while Larry is much better known among the steeplechase set. But one of their products recently notched his first stakes victory to give the couple a little limelight.

On the afternoon of Saturday, October 12 at Parx, Winchill garnered the first stakes victory of his career when he rallied from just off the pace to capture the \$75,000 First Responder Stakes by three-quarters of a length over fellow PA-Bred Norman Asbjornson. The 5-year-old son of Tapit out of the graded stakes-placed Phone Trick mare Exclusive Hold covered the mile and a sixteenth over the main track - the race was originally scheduled on the turf - in 1:43.20 for his

second win in seven starts this year and his fifth victory from 21 career outings, pushing his lifetime total to \$266,094.

"One of the first Christmas presents I ever got was a pitchfork," Larry Ensor said. "I learned how to use it quite efficiently. I spent four years at the Fasig-Tipton sales company before opening my own bloodstock agency in Lexington, Ky., the Wall Street of Thoroughbred breeding. I did that for 20 years and then moved to Pennsylvania to our current farm. I know basically every major breeder in the industry and if I don't I know someone that does."

Winchill launched his career in good fashion, winning a maiden special weight at Ellis Park in his debut in September 2010 for Heiligbrodt Racing Stable. When that stable dispersed less than a year later, Pewter Stable purchased the 3-year-old winner of two races for

\$52,000. Trained by Kathleen DeMasi for the partership of Robert Levy, Pewter Racing and Alex Karkenny and racing in Pennsylvania, Winchill won an allowance in November 2011 at Parx after placing in two stakes earlier that fall. He wouldn't return to the winner's circle until this past August at Parx, a span of 21 months. But his first stakes tally did not require as lengthy a wait.

Larry Ensor is still active on the steeplechase scene, while Laura Ensor remains very active in every aspect of the stables, the breeding and foaling of the horses and daily activities in the shedrow. The Ensors are equally as active with the training of Off-The-Track-Thoroughbreds, including getting back horses they've bred, reschooling and sending them on to new homes and new careers. And they encourage others to do the same.
