# Strawbridge's Pennsylvania Legacy: Decades of Excellence



Vignette doesn't roam the fields of Derry Meeting Farm anymore, but she continues to bring credit to the state's breeding program through her Pennsylvania-bred offspring. She's a Pennsylvania-bred herself, a product of George Strawbridge's outstanding breeding operation that, sadly for him and for Pennsylvania, has moved to Kentucky.

Strawbridge moved his 14 broodmares, including Vignette, to Kentucky last summer after Derry Meeting Farm in Unionville was sold. Strawbridge had kept his horses there "forever," he says. "Forever" dates to 1973.

"I have a lot of pleasant memories and had a great deal of success raising horses there," he says. "So it's all very sad, very nostalgic."

"What was a complete shock to me was that nobody was interested in buying Derry Meeting Farm as a broodmare farm. It was on the market for over a year, and not one interested party from any Pennsylvania breeding operation, or any breeding operation, came forward to maintain it as a single entity. So it had to be sold off in three separate parcels. This is a farm that had an extraordinary production record. Yet nobody, absolutely nobody, was interested in continuing it as a broodmare farm."

Bettina Jenney, who ran the farm after her husband Marshall died in 2000, sold it after deciding to retire. Marshall Jenney had bought it in 1964. Derry Meeting co-bred Danzig and foaled Storm Cat—two of the most influential sires in the world. It bred

or raised champions and Breeders' Cup winners. And Strawbridge was its most prominent client because of astute decisions such as breeding Vignette to the Kentucky stallion Dynaformer.

He did it three times, and each time the foal, whom Strawbridge kept and raced, grew to become a stakes winner in England. The most recent was Flying Officer (born in 2010), who won the Further Flight Stakes on April 9 at Nottingham.

Flying Officer's older brothers—

Thought Worthy (born in 2009) and Lucarno (born in 2004)—won more prestigious stakes. (Flying Officer will have his chance at more prestigious stakes this summer.) In 2012, Thought Worthy won the Great Voltigeur, a Group 2 stakes at York. And in 2007, Lucarno won not only the Great Voltigeur but also the St. Leger at Doncaster. The Group 1 St. Leger is England's oldest and longest (1¾ miles) classic race.

"He's the only American-bred and -owned horse to win the St. Leger," Strawbridge says.

The Dynaformer—Vignette mating combined Vignette's speed (she won four turf sprints including a 5½-furlong stakes) with Dynaformer's stamina influence. It clicked. Why?

"I don't really know," Strawbridge says. "It's the uncertainty of the gene pool, I guess."

Vignette's foals by other stallions, including North Light (Ire) and Giant's Causeway, have also fared well. Of seven that started, six won, Strawbridge says. But only the three by Dynaformer won stakes.

Unfortunately, Strawbridge won't be breeding more Dynaformer—Vignette Pennsylvania-breds. Dynaformer died in 2012 at age 27. And the last of Strawbridge's Pennsylvania-breds were born in 2013, including a Vignette filly by Giant's Causeway now romping at Stone Farm in Paris, Ky., along with Strawbridge's other

Pennsylvania-bred yearlings. (Two he's most excited about are fillies out of his mares Dynamic Cat and Dynamic Holiday. The sires are Henrythenavigator and Quality Road, respectively.)

Strawbridge has kept a few broodmares at Stone Farm for several years, including Forever Together and No Matter What. In 2006, No Matter What foaled a Dynaformer filly, Rainbow View, at Stone Farm who became a champion at 2 and 3 in Europe.

"It's a helluva productive farm," Strawbridge says of Stone. "So I just exchanged one productive farm for another productive farm."

Asked whether it feels odd no longer producing Pennsylvania-breds, Strawbridge says:

"Slightly odd, because the Kentucky breeding program isn't nearly as good as Pennsylvania's. But look, the thing that's important to me is raising good horses. Stone

Farm is very productive land. It puts a lot of bone on horses. So I've taken my horses where I think they're going to produce and thrive."

The 19-year-old Vignette foaled a colt by Giant's Causeway in March. Going back to a formula that worked, but with Dynaformer no longer available, Strawbridge bred her this year to Point of Entry, a son of Dynaformer who won five Grade 1 stakes.

"Maybe we can recapture the magic," Strawbridge says. 🌿



# Pennsylvania-Breds Provide Stakes Action Galore!

East Coast, West Coast and all around the country—PA-breds have been in action and acquitting themselves well all spring.

## PRINCESS OF SYLMAR

The 2013 Pennsylvania-bred Horse of the Year and champion 3-year-old filly made a successful debut at 4, returning from a five-month layoff to capture the \$100,000 Cat Cay Stakes at Aqueduct on April 6.


Last year Ed Stanco's homebred daughter of Majestic Warrior won four Grade 1s and was runnerup for an Eclipse Award. With aims to get the big award this year, the 'Princess' is being targeted for the Grade 1, \$1 million Ogden Phipps on June 7, Belmont Stakes Day at Belmont Park, by trainer Todd Pletcher. That race is also on the agenda for Beholder, who snatched the Eclipse away after winning the Breeders' Cup Distaff-G1 in California, in which Princess of Sylmar finished off the board.

And what other races has Pletcher penciled in for the summer? "We'll see after that, but I think races like the Delaware Handicap and the Personal Ensign and Beldame are a possibility. One thing with her is we're always trying to be aware of is keeping her weight up. It's a long season and considering that she runs well fresh, we probably won't look for a prep for the Ogden Phipps in between."

## WATERWAY RUN

Globe-trotting filly Waterway Run broke through with her first U.S. stakes win in Belmont Park's Grade 3 Beaugay on May 3 after an exciting stretch battle to win by a neck. The Chad Brown-trainee had been caught late in her previous start, the Grade 3 Hillsborough Stakes at Tampa Bay, losing by a nose. Her most recent win was her fourth in 11 starts, all on the turf, and boosted her earnings to \$182,789.

Now owned by Martin Schwartz, Waterway Run launched her career in England for Thurloe Thoroughbreds XX and won the Group 3 Sakhee Oh So Sharp Stakes at 2

before heading to Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf-G1, where she finished sixth. At 3, she ran in England and France, contested the classic Poule d'Essai des Pouliches-G1 and eventually made her way back to the states. In her three starts this year she has never been worse than second.

A 4-year-old daughter of Arch out of Princess Consort, by Dixieland Band, Waterway Run was bred by Dorothy A. Matz and sold as a yearling at Keeneland September for \$15,000.

## STORMING INTI

While many trainers point their good 3-year-olds to the Triple Crown races on the dirt, Storming Inti, the Stormy Atlantic colt out of the Pulpit mare Tarfaya bred by

Brushwood Stable, is continuing on a lucrative path on the turf.

Trainer Chad Brown sent the chestnut out for the Grade 2 American Turf Stakes at Churchill Downs on the Kentucky Derby undercard on May 3 and saw him just miss, being caught at the wire to finish second to Global View. It was his second graded stakes-placing of the year, having been third, a half length behind the winner, in Gulfstream Park's Palm Beach Stakes-G3 in March. But the three-time stakes winner boasts an impressive record of 8-4-1-2 and earnings of \$315,455.

Future stakes engagements on the grass could include the \$500,000 Penn Mile at Penn National on May 31 and the inaugural \$1.25 million Belmont Derby Invitational on July 5 at Belmont Park.

# PA-bred Stakes Action Continues

## MISS BEHAVIOUR

Last year at 2, Miss Behaviour enjoyed a solid campaign that included stakes victories in the Sorority at Monmouth Park and the Grade 2 Matron at Belmont Park. She kicked off her 3-year-old season by finishing third in Pimlico's \$100,000 Stormy Blues Stakes. Cal MacWilliam and Neil Teitelbaum's homebred daughter of Jump Start trained by Phil Schoenthal has been entered in the Miss Preakness Stakes at Pimlico on Black-Eyed Susan Day, Friday, May 16.

## FAVORITE TALE

Owner-breeder Paul Conaway's Favorite Tale won the first three starts of his career at Parx in stellar fashion, including a maiden special weight debut going six furlongs in 1:07.66, before suffering his first setback when fading to seventh in the Grade 3 Bay Shore Stakes in April. Trainer Guadalupe Preciado regrouped and had the Tale of the Cat colt ready for action one month later and Favorite Tale delivered, recording his first stakes victory in Belmont Park's Gold Fever on May 4. Among those in the beaten field was Grade 1 winner Havana.



## SUPERMONIC

Another sophomore colt fresh off his stakes debut is Supermonic, third in the \$200,000 Coolmore Lexington Stakes-G3 at Keeneland on April 19.

The son of Latent Heat trained by Todd Pletcher needed four starts to garner his diploma when taking a maiden special weight at Penn National in March, then won an allowance at Keeneland six days before competing in the Lexington. Pletcher has not indicated where Supermonic will run next, since the colt still fits allowance conditions. From six starts, he has two wins, two seconds and a third.

## ROADHOG

Roadhog, a PA-bred with a fondness for the grass, finished second in his 7-year-old debut on April 19 in the \$100,000 Henry S. Clark Stakes at Pimlico when nailed at the wire by Hamp in a game effort. The Bowman's



Band gelding owned and bred by Ellendale Racing and trained by Elizabeth Merryman owns a 9-5-4 slate and \$544,714 bankroll from 30 lifetime outings. Last fall he edged Maryland-bred star Ben's Cat to capture the Maryland Million Turf at Laurel Park.

Like Ben's Cat, Roadhog has always displayed a fondness for the Pimlico turf course and he could make his next appearance in the Grade 2, \$400,000 Dixie Stakes on the Preakness Stakes undercard on May 17, which this year has been shortened to a mile and a sixteenth. 🌸



# Pennsylvania News Briefs

## Pennsylvania Board of Director Nominees

The nominating committee submitted four candidates to fill the four vacancies on the PHBA Board of Directors. The terms for the newly elected members will be four years.

The association bylaws state that "Additional nominations to the Board of Directors may be made at least 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association by the presentation of a petition signed by at least 10 percent of the regular members." Regular members are those members whose dues were paid by March 31, 2014.

The annual meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, May 21.

The four nominees are:

**Elizabeth Barr** (Chester County)—Mrs. Barr is a lifelong horsewoman and operates

a family farm outside of Marshallton. Mrs. Barr has been involved in breeding, training and stallion syndicates. She is a senior vice-president for business development at Beneficial Bank. This would be Mrs. Barr's first term on the board.

**Henry R. Nothhaft** (Saratoga, Calif.)—Mr. Nothhaft is a businessman based in California with a background in telecommunications and networking companies. He has an interest in a number of Pennsylvania-based stallions and is an active breeder of PA-breds. Mr. Nothhaft is a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy and is a former officer in the Marine Corps. This would be Mr. Nothhaft's first term on the board.

**Gregory C. Newell** (Chester County)—Mr. Newell founded Nave Newell in 1992—a

civil engineering firm based in Wayne. He has been active in the racing industry through his Newell Thoroughbreds. Mr. Newell is a participant in numerous community organizations including the Devereux Foundation. This would be Mr. Newell's first term on the board.


**Rick Abbott** (Chester County)—Mr. Abbott is a leading commercial sales agent who with his wife Dixie operates Charlton Bloodstock. Mr. Abbott served as a member of the PA State Horse Racing Commission for 13 years, is a former member of the Board of Directors of Fasig-Tipton Midlantic and has served with several other industry entities. He is a current PHBA board member and is currently the PHBA's secretary, and is eligible to serve another term.

## Divine Fortune Adds Gr. 1 Iroquois To Laurels

Bill Pape and Jonathan Sheppard's homebred 2013 Eclipse Award-winning Steeplechaser Divine Fortune (right) made his 2014 debut a winning one by taking the Grade 1 Houghland Iroquois Hurdle Stakes at Percy Warner in Tennessee on May 10. The 9-year-old son of Royal Anthem broke through after finishing second in the race the past two years. In recording his second Grade 1 win in his past three starts, Divine Fortune upped his career earnings to \$712,295.

## Bessie's Boy: First PA-Bred Juvenile Winner of 2014

Bessie's Boy, a son of Smoke Glacken bred by Charles Zacney and sold as a weanling for \$15,500 at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed sale, won first time out at Pimlico on April 17 to become the first Pennsylvania-bred 2-year-old winner from the crop of 2012. Trained by Wesley Ward for Ice Wine Stable, the bay gelding made a four-wide move into the turn and drove home a three-quarter-length winner in the four and a half furlong maiden special weight as the 3-5 favorite. His next scheduled start is the Rollicking Stakes on Friday, May 16 at Pimlico.





# Pennsylvania Stallions Making Headlines

## ALBERT THE GREAT

Moonshine Mullin led early and battled back late to capture Churchill Downs' Grade 2 Alysheba Stakes on May 2, defeating a field that included champion Will Take Charge. The 6-year-old son of Albert the Great was a stakes winner at 3 the year he was second in the Grade 2 Jim Dandy, but hadn't run in stakes company for over a year and a half. Two-thirds of Albert the Great's stakes winners have now won in graded company. The multi-millionaire stands at Pin Oak Lane Farm.

## FLASHY BULL

Flashy American, a 5-year-old daughter of Penn Ridge Farms stallion Flashy Bull, won her fourth stakes, and first in graded company, when taking Hawthorne's Grade 3 Sixty Sails Handicap on April 19. The earner of \$515,163 out of the Quiet American mare Inn Between is owned by Preston Stables LLC and trained by Ken McPeck.

## JUMP START

A mid-May Pennsylvania-bred filly by Jump Start impressed buyers and sold for \$160,000 to Alex and JoAnn Lieblong at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's 2014 Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training on Wednesday, April 23. Out of the Dayjur mare Taanis, the filly is from the second Pennsylvania-sired crop of Jump Start, who stands at Northview PA.

## REAL QUIET

The Derby/Preakness winner, who stood five years in Pennsylvania until his death at age 15 in September 2010, got his latest stakes winner most appropriately on the first Saturday in May when Where's Rosie B led from start to finish to take the Foxy J. G. Stakes at Parx Racing on May 3. It was the fourth win in a row for the 5-year-old mare bred and owned by Michael Jester. Champion Real Quiet stood at Jester's Penn Ridge Farm his final three seasons.

## WISEMAN'S FERRY

Two-time Horse of the Year Wise Dan became the richest gelding in history to race in the U.S., surpassing John Henry, with his incredibly gutsy win in Churchill Downs' Woodford Reserve Turf Classic Stakes-G1 on Derby Day. In winning for the 21st time in 29 starts, the 7-year-old chestnut son of Wiseman's Ferry has now earned \$6,802,920. Wiseman's Ferry stands at Dana Point Farm.
