# Winchill brings Tapit connection to Pennsylvania

Call him "that Tapit stallion." That's how breeders are referring to Winchill, a son of Tapit who will stand his first year at stud in 2015 at Pointer Farm near Bernville.

Winchill will be the first son of Tapit to stand in Pennsylvania. If you can't afford the \$300,000 to breed to Tapit, the country's leading sire (standing at Gainesway Farm in Kentucky), then you can spend \$3,000 to breed to Winchill.

Heck, Winchill won twice as many races as Tapit and raced 22 times compared to Tapit's six. Of course, Tapit won the Wood Memorial Stakes at Aqueduct, whereas Winchill won the First Responder Stakes at Parx.

Winchill raced for Pewter Stable from August of his 3-year-old season in 2011 to his retirement at 6. Pewter Stable bought him in July 2011 for \$52,000 at the Fasig-Tipton dispersal of the Heiligbrodt Racing Stable. Before that, Winchill, trained by Dale Romans, won two of five races at Ellis Park, Presque Isle Downs and Churchill Downs.

Kate DeMasi trained Winchill for Pewter Stable and raced him primarily at Parx. He won four of 17 races for her. DeMasi's husband Greg is syndicate manager of Pewter Stable. Formed more than 20 years ago, it has more than 40 horses in training.

Greg DeMasi says that after Winchill made his final start last June (a victory at Parx, increasing his earnings to \$288,294), it just made sense to stand him at stud. He is after all a Pennsylvania-bred (bred by Gum Tree Stables and partners). His dam Exclusive Hold, by Phone Trick, was a fine racehorse, finishing second in 1996 in the Schuylverville and third in the Adirondack, both Grade 2 stakes at Saratoga; as a broodmare she has produced 10 foals, of which seven started and six won. And finally, DeMasi says, he had the perfect place to stand Winchill: Pointer Farm. Jodie Pointer and her husband Tommy own the farm, situated about 30 miles east of Philadelphia Park, where Tommy works as a jockeys' agent. Jodie says they bought this farm seven years ago after owning and operating the old Bonita Farm in Maryland.

The horse industry in Maryland was struggling, so they decided to move to Pennsylvania. "It's worked out wonderfully," she says.

The farm specializes in breaking yearlings for the track but also has a 25-stall barn for layups and cares for more than 30 broodmares. The Pointers also operate Cabin Creek Rescue, taking in, retraining and finding homes for retired thoroughbreds.

They've worked with Pewter Stable, foaling its broodmares and handling its layups. Winchill is the first stallion to stand at Pointer Farm.

Breeders started asking about him immediately, Jodie says. "You have that Tapit stallion?" they ask.

"He's a nice horse with a nice personality-not one of those crazy colts that would be difficult to handle," Jodie says, explaining her decision to stand a stallion. "I just figured, if I'm going to do it, he's the one to do it with."

# **Synopsis of PA-Bred Stakes: Versatility and Talent on Display**

Five stakes on the Pennsylvania Day At the Races' 12-race card for state-breds, plus six additional PA-Bred stakes were run from September through December. The following is a brief synopsis of each race and winner.

#### **PA DAY AT THE RACES -**Parx Racing, Sept. 6

#### \$75,000 Banjo Picker Sprint S

3 & up, 6 fur., Sept. 6 1st: Rustler Hustler: 2nd: Res Judicata: 3rd: Officer Alex

Waldorf Racing Stables LLC's Rustler Hustler got his first stakes win in nearly four vears with a determined stretch drive in the Banjo Picker Sprint, turning away odds-on favorite Res Judicata to win by three-quarters of a length. At 16-1, the longest shot on the board of the five starters, the son of Ecton Park bred by Mark Stanley put together a 6-year-old campaign of 8-2-2-2 for yearend earnings of \$102,495. He concluded his season with an allowance win at Parx on Oct. 21, which pushed his career earnings to \$498.491.

#### \$75,000 Roanoke S

3 & up, 1 1/16 mi. 1st: Traffic Light; 2nd: Keepmeinstitches; 3rd: Sailor's Revenge

Leading at every call, John Trippi's Traffic Light strolled home a three and a guarter-length winner to gain his third career stakes win and push his total earnings to \$503,220. A stakes winner each year from 3 to 5, the son of Peace Rules bred by Dixiana Farms LLC has won or placed in 15 of his 22 starts. 3 & up, 5 fur., turf 1st: Merry's Honor; 2nd: Oklahoma Crude; 3rd: Atlantic Seaboard


In the most exciting finish on the card, Merry's Honor got the win by a nose as four horses hit the wire together. The Pewter Stable homebred trained by Kate De-Masi got his first stakes win and became the first stakes winner for his dam Merry Princess, herself a multiple stakes winner of \$319,164 for Pewter Stable. A son of former Pennsylvania stallion Congressionalhonor, lightly-raced Merry's Honor, now 6, has 15 career starts, won or placed nine times, and was third in the 2013 running of the Marshall Jenney Handicap in his only other stakes outing.

#### \$75,000 Dr. Teresa Garofalo Memorial

3YO fillies, 6 fur. 1st: Aunt Ellipsis: 2nd: Pixie Dust: 3rd: Disco Chick

Aunt Ellipsis got her third win in a row and her second stakes win of the year with her one and three-guarters-length score for owner Vince Campanella. The Successful Appeal filly bred by Truxton Stables captured the Donna Freyer Stakes in February. In 10 starts at 3, she won four times, was second twice and third three times. for earnings of \$169,466. On the board in both her starts at 2, she has earned a total of \$203,066.

George Strawbridge Jr.'s Augustin Stable homebred Appealing Cat won the featured event of the day by a length and a half, gaining her first stakes victory and becoming the third Pennsylvania-bred stakes winner for her Pennsylvania-bred stakes-winning dam Dynamic Cat, who won the same race in 2005. Appealing Cat, a daughter of Successful Appeal, followed with a third-place finish in Keeneland's Dowager Stakes. Earlier in her career she placed in the Endeavour Stakes-G3 and Gallorette Handicap-G3 and Malvern Rose Stakes. She is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Dynamic Holiday, stakes winner Cat's Holiday, her entrymate who finished behind her in fourth in the Mrs. Penny, and graded stakes-placed Cat Park.

A half-brother to 2014 stakes winner Bold Curlin bred by Two Sisters Farm, Duff came back to win the Christopher Elser Memorial Stakes in November, concluding his year with a record of 6-3-1-1 for earnings of \$133,220.

# Pennsylvania Stallions Making Headlines

### **YEAR OF GRADE 1 SUCCESS**

The year-end total of Grade/Group 1-siring Pennsylvania stallions, who currently stand or completed their stud careers in the state, was seven. That number doesn't include two who left the state after the 2014 breeding season.

The leader was Northview PA's Jump Start, the sire of two Argentinian stars – Idolo Porteno, winner of the Dardo Rocha and Carlos Pellegrini in back-to-back starts in November and December, and Livingstone, who captured the Estrellas Mile. Also siring winners at the highest level were Wiseman's Ferry (Dana Point), whose son, two-time Horse of the Year Wise Dan, was undefeated in four starts, all graded stakes, including three Grade 1s; Albert the Great (Pin Oak Lane), sire of Moonshine Mullin; the late Rockport Harbor, sire of Majestic Harbor, and Silver Train (Headline News), who stood at Pin Oak Lane and Northview PA, respectively; Northview PA's Smarty Jones (Smart D N A) and Dana Point's Sir Shackleton (Manola).

Two stallions who last stood at Pin Oak Lane – Any Given Saturday, the leader of all stallions by number of mares bred in the Mid-Atlantic region in 2014 with 100 reported, and Offlee Wild – were the sires of Grade 1 winners Hoppertunity and Bayern, respectively. Both stallions were sold to international interests late in the year, with Any Given Saturday going to Korea and Offlee Wild to Turkey.

### **BULLSBAY IS REGION'S TOP JUVENILE SIRE WITH FIRST CROP**

Led by two stakes performers among his four winners from nine starters, Bullsbay led all active Mid-Atlantic sires on the leading 2-year-old sires list by North American earnings, from just 23 foals in his first crop. The 11-year-old son of Tiznow was represented by stakes winner Miss Bullistic, winner of the Selima and Donna Freyer Stakes, second in the Maryland Juvenile Filly Championship and his leading earner of the year with \$161,620. His first winner, Bullheaded Boy, who won first time out at Saratoga, was four-times stakes-placed and accrued \$131,300 from six starts.

Bullsbay moved to Northview PA for the start of the 2014 season after standing at the Maryland division his first three seasons. The Grade 1 winner stands for \$3,000 in 2015.

### **FIRST FOAL FOR EL PADRINO**

The first foal to arrive in El Padrino's first crop was born Jan. 18 at Sycamore Hall Farm in Chesapeake City, Md., out of the Great Notion mare Great Storm. The bay filly, also the first foal for her dam, "is large and stout, especially for a first foal from a mare, nice head, very good bone," said farm manager David Wade, adding they are "quite happy with her."

El Padrino launched his career at Northview PA in 2014 and was the busiest first-year sire in the region when covering 89 mares. The graded stakes-winning son of Pulpit and half-brother to multiple Grade 1 winner and millionaire Verrazano from an impeccable family, El Padrino stands for \$5,000 live foal.
