Walnut Green Farm: Of Historic Significance

The rich history of Walnut Green Farm spans 35 years and includes some of the mightiest names in Pennsylvania's racing history. In the decade since Mark Reid took over the operation he has built upon its foundation by adding even more names to the list. Go for Wand, Plum Pretty and Saint Liam are just some of the names that have come through the Walnut Green program or have been managed by Reid.

Before the farm churned out some of racing's stars, Walnut Green was the name of the bloodstock agency launched by brothers Richard and Russell Jones in the mid-1970s. They opened Walnut Green Farm in 1980, and just three years later made headlines with record-setting broodmare Producer, sold in foal to Northern Dancer for \$5,250,000.

"We sold a lot of young horses that were successful racehorses," Russell Jones said. "We also sold a number of yearlings for over \$1 million apiece."

The Joneses had several farm locations in a one-and-a-half-mile radius with separate areas for foaling, training and sales prep. "We spread them apart as a safety measure for disease control," Jones said. "It was a compartmentalized kind of deal. We enhanced each location as the company grew."

One of the first great runners raised on the farm was Mrs. Jane duPont Lung-

er's National Racing Hall of Fame member Go for Wand. Often called ill-fated because of her untimely death in the 1990 Breeders' Cup Distaff-G1, Go for Wand won the 1989 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies-G1, was an Eclipse Award winner at 2 and 3 and earned \$1,373,338 with 10 wins in 13 starts, including seven Grade 1 victories.

The brothers became so successful that they were asked to move to Kentucky. "We both grew up in Chester County," Jones said, "and although there were temptations put out for us to move to Kentucky,

Reid, the all-time leading trainer at Philadelphia Park/Parx Racing, was looking for a change.

"I had retired from training in the early 1990s," Reid said. "I had a good career, nothing stupendous and won a dozen training titles. I got out of it because I had three boys going through high school and college sports and I wanted to spend time with them."

Reid dispersed his 150-horse racing stable, then left the racetrack for a few years, only to return and take up training again. "I felt the noose tighten as more horses came into the stable. I decided to switch to buying and selling instead, to not be on that seven-day a week grind."

In 2000 Reid began moving horses back and forth between consumers in Penn-

d'Oro and You. Reid also managed the career of 2005 Eclipse Horse of the Year Saint Liam, who was owned by William Warren.

"My initial voyage was going to tracks and just buying horses for my friends, but it expanded," Reid explained. "I thought that having a farm set up, it would all blend

well together. I contacted the Joneses, bought bloodtheir stock agency and leased all the farm land." **Partners** Tony Dutrow and Jim DiCicco were involved in the transaction and Russell Jones



stayed on for three more years to ease the transition.

Once a vast network of four farms and 400 acres, Walnut Green now sits on a hundred acres and offers a wide array of services from boarding and foaling to sales preparation. "I've even opened a little racing stable in Delaware," Reid said, "which is for

our clients that want to stay with us all the way through the process."

When it comes to breeding mares Reid is realistic of his expectations. "We don't go out trying to change the breed," he said. "I'm just trying to breed horses that will be popular at the sales."

Reid was responsible for the purchase of the A.P. Indy mare Liszy, who foaled Medaglia d'Oro filly at Walnut Green in 2008. That filly, Plum Pretty, went on to earn

\$1,688,745, and win the 2011 Kentucky Oaks-G1. She took the Apple Blossom Handicap-G1 a year later and sold for \$4.2 million at the 2012 Keeneland November sale.

"She is the high point 10 years into this," Reid said. "To have produced an Oaks winner who was foaled right here next to the farm's driveway."

Another horse touched by the Walnut Green program is current 2-year-old Tonasah, a daughter of Malibu Moon who broke her maiden first out at Belmont Park in July. The Todd Pletcher-trainee finished third in the Matron Stakes-G2 on Oct. 18, her second graded placing in four starts.

The venture was no instantaneous success as the economic crash of 2008 brought about financial hardship. "Pennsylvania had recently gotten slot machines so I thought I would ride the wave of slot machine money. It ended up tougher than I thought it would be, but it is its own reward. I'm out in beautiful countryside, in a hilly area, close to Philadelphia, New York and Maryland. I can get to nine racetracks on a tank of gas."

Although he is starting to downsize the broodmare band because of his age, Reid is aware of the historical impact of the farm. "This place had a tremendous impact before I was here," he said. "It has a history and will continue to have a place in history going forward. We put together breeding and racing partnerships, we buy and sell for middle markets, we breed for clients and we advise on buying or pricing yearlings. And that sums up Walnut Green."

PA stallions top in region for 2015 RMB



El Padrino and Jump Start—who both stand at Northview PA in Peach Bottom—were the only two stallions in the Mid-Atlantic region to breed more than 100 mares in 2015, based on reports received by The Jockey Club through mid-October.

A total of 42 Pennsylvania stallions had Reports of Mares Bred submitted for the 2015 breeding season to date. El Padrino,

a 6-year-old son of Pulpit, was bred to 109 mares in his second season. Current leading Mid-Atlantic stallion Jump Start, who commands the region's highest stud fee at \$10,000, covered 102 mares. Pin Oak Lane bolsters stallion roster

Two stallions with excellent credentials have been added for the 2016 season at Dr. Bill Solomon's Pin Oak Lane Farm in New Freedom: Lord Shanakill, one of the top first-crop sires in Europe in 2014, and multiple graded stakes-winning millionaire Last Gunfighter.

Lord Shanakill, a 9-year-old son of champion sprinter Speightstown out of the Theatrical (Ire) mare Green Room, moves from the Irish National Stud to Pennsylvania with four stakes performers, three group/graded, from two crops of racing age. He ranked second among Europe's freshman sires by number of winners in 2014, with 16 world-wide.

His runners have amassed more than \$1 million and include 2015 stakes performers My Dream Boat, winner of the Prix Perth-G3 in France; Great Dancer (Ire), third in the Hill Prince Stakes-G3 at Belmont Park; and Mister Brightside (Ire), second in Santa Anita's Twilight Derby-G2 in his only U.S. start.

""He's a Speightstown Group 1 winner who came within an eyelash of being a champion at 2 and 3," said Solomon. "He was a very fast horse. And Speightstowns are probably a little better on the dirt than on the turf. Plus he has an outstanding pedigree for both the grass and the dirt. I think he'll be a great fit."

Lord Shanakill's dam, a half-sister to Grade 1 winner Spanish Fern and to the dam of Santa Anita Handicap-G1 winner and millionaire Heatseeker (Ire), has also produced Group 1 winner Together Forever.

Lord Shanakill remains the property of the Irish National Stud syndicate and stands for \$5,000, with the fee discounted to \$3,500 for two or more mares.

Last Gunfighter, bred and owned by John Gunther, earned \$1,219,205 from 21 starts, winning nine times, seven in stakes. His victories included the Grade 2 Hawthorne Gold Cup and three Grade 3 stakes—the Pimlico Special, Excelsior and Philip H. Iselin Stakes. "He's a very attractive horse who beat a lot of good horses," noted Solomon. A winner at distances from one mile to a mile and a quarter, Last Gunfighter outfinished classic winners Palace Malice, Orb and Ruler On Ice and millionaires Game On Dude, Flat Out, Moreno, Richard's Kid, Alpha, Paynter and Eighttofasttocatch during his career. In his only start this year, Last Gunfighter finished third behind eventual Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile-G1 winner Liam's Map in a one-mile allowance at Belmont Park.

A 6-year-old son of multiple Grade 1 winner First Samurai, Last Gunfighter is out of the Sir Cat mare Saratoga Cat, a half-sister to multiple stakes winners Saratoga Boot and Sexy Boots. His second dam, Saratoga Sparkle (by Saratoga Six), is a half-sister to multiple graded winner Costly Shoes. The family includes Eclipse Award-winning 2-year-old and champion sire Dehere.

Last Gunfighter stands his first season for \$4,000, or \$2,500 for two or more mares.

Pants On Fire retires to Diamond B

Millionaire Pants On Fire, a son of the Mid-Atlantic region's leading sire Jump Start, has been retired Glenn and Becky Brok's Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville. The property of MMG Stables LLC, he'll stand for \$5,000 with special consideration to Pennsylvania foaling mares.



Pants On Fire was a winner every year from ages 2 to 7, for a record of 11-5-8 from 35 starts while earning \$1,641,375. His eight stakes victories included the Grade 2 Louisiana Derby (over Nehro and Mucho Macho Man),

and the Grade 3 Pegasus Stakes at 3, and the Grade 2 Monmouth Park Cup and Grade 3 Ack Ack Handicap at 5. His seven graded stakes-placings include a third in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile-G1. In the final start of his career, he won his second consecutive Wild and Wonderful Stakes this past September.

Pants On Fire is out of the Cape Town mare Cabo de Noche, a half-sister to stakes-winning graded stakes-placed sprinter Hatfield and stakes-winning Grade 1 stakes-placed Key Hunter. He descends from the prolific family of Edward P. Evans' foundation mare Flight Dancer, which includes Horse of the Year and successful sire Saint Liam and Grade 1 sires Silver Ghost and Prospector's Music.

Broad Rule new to Pheasant House Farm

Broad Rule, a 7-year-old multiple stakes winner and half-brother to Grade 1-winning millionaire Include and seven other stakes performers, will stand his first season in 2016 at Casey and Sally Barnes' Pheasant House Farm in Dallastown. His stud fee is \$1,000 live foal.

Making 51 starts over six seasons, the son of Dixie Union won back-to-back runnings of the 6-furlong Fire Plug Stakes at Laurel, and his six stakes-placings included a third in the General George Handicap-G3. He earned \$435,895 with a record of 8-10-10.



His dam, graded stakes winner Illeria, produced 13 foals, all starters, 10 winners and eight earnings more than \$100,000. Grade 1 Pimlico Special Stakes winner Include amassed \$1,659,560 and went on to become a major sire. Counted among his 42 stakes winners is 2015 Mother Goose Stakes-G1 winner Include Betty.

Illeria is also the dam of stakes winners Magic Broad, winner of the Grade 3 Selima; \$645,330-earner Encaustic, and Magical Broad, and stakes-placed Implicit, Loaded Brush, Invent and Officer's Holiday.

Broad Rule's second dam, Baldski's Holiday, and third dam, Verset Holiday, were also stakes winners.



Eclipticalspraline stands first season

Maria Haire's Eclipticalspraline, a 7-year-old winning son of stakes sire Ecliptical, will stand his first season for \$1,200 live foal, payable when the foal stands and nurses, at Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville.

Eclipticalspraline is from the male line of leading sire Exclusive Native with a pedigree free of Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector but doubling up on Bold Ruler. A winner at $7\frac{1}{2}$ furlongs and $1\frac{1}{6}$ miles on the grass, he earned \$48,389 and is one of eight winners for his dam Ms. Mostly, winner of the Grade 2 Pucker Up Stakes and earner of \$276.525.

Seven-year-old Eclipticalspraline is a half-brother to stakes performers Hurta, an earner of \$275,996, and Ms. Moscow, and stakes producer Most Awesome. Eclipticalspraline's stakes-winning third dam, Tappahannock, is a full-sister to Cascapedia, the Eclipse Award-winning older mare of 1977. Also found in the family is U.A.E. highweighted sprinter and millionaire Big Jag, Grade/Group 1 winners Republic Lass, Acey Deucey and Captive Miss, and graded winners Glacial Stream and Cascading Gold.

Juvenile stakes winner for Talent Search

Talent Search, the top-ranked first-, second- and third-crop sire in the Mid-Atlantic region the past three years, got his first stakes winner when the 2-year-old filly Special Talent galloped home $3\frac{1}{2}$ lengths in front in Indiana Grand Race Course's City of Anderson Stakes on Sept. 30.

Owned by Daniel Bell and trained by Barbara McBride, Special Talent was bred in Indiana by Larry Goodwin out of the Lii's Lad mare Lady Kilkeelan. She is one of five winners from eight starters in Talent Search's current crop of 2-year-olds.


Talent Search is a multiple stakes-winning sprinter whose six stakes placings included the Grade 1 Breeders' Cup Sprint, Vosburgh and Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash. Now 12, he stands at Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville for \$2,500 live foal, payable when the foal stands and nurses, with special consideration to Pennsylvania foaling mares.

Pennsylvania News Briefs

Alphabet Soup takes up residence at Old Friends in Kentucky



Alphabet Soup, the PA-Bred winner of the 1996 Breeders' Cup Classic-G1, has been retired from stud and is now a resident of Old Friends, the Thoroughbred Retirement Center in Georgetown, Ky. The handsome 24-year-old gray son of Cozzene, featured in last month's Blast from the Past in the *PA Thoroughbred Report*, arrived on Oct. 26, five days before this year's running of the Breeders' Cup Classic.

The third richest PA-Bred runner in history, with \$2,990,270 in total earnings, Alphabet Soup stood his stud career for Adena Spring Farms and sired the earners of close to \$41 million. His 48 stakes winners include Dubai Golden Shaheen-G1 winner Our New Recruit and Canadian champions Alpha Bettor and Phantom Light.

Favorite Tale finishes third in Breeders' Cup Sprint

At odds of nearly 24-1 in the 14-horse Breeders' Cup Sprint-G1 field, Favorite Tale turned in a terrific performance to finish third, less than two lengths behind winner Runhappy, over the Keeneland surface on Oct. 31. PJG Stable's son of Tale of the Cat trained by Guadalupe Preciado earned \$150,000 for the effort, upping his 2015 total to \$398,300 from six starts. During his sensational campaign, the Paul Conoway-bred runner has finished in the top three five times, with other highlights including a stakes win in the Grade 2 Smile Sprint at Gulfstream Park and a third in Saratoga's Grade 1 Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap.

Strawbridge stable a dominant force

In less than four weeks, five homebred runners from George Strawbridge's Augustin Stable captured graded stakes, including four within a four-day span in October. Four of the quintet are PA-Breds, the most recent the 4-year-old filly Spelling Again, who scored easily on Nov. 7 in the Grade 2 Chilukki Stakes at Churchill Downs. By Awesome Again out of Alphabet Soup's daughter Spelling, Spelling Again is a half-sister to another Strawbridge stakes winner, Sky Willow.

Two of the Strawbridge runners have long ties to the state. Holiday Star, repeat winner of the Sycamore Stakes-G3 at Keeneland on Oct. 15 from the barn of trainer Graham Motion, is by Harlan's Holiday out of Spring Star (by Deputy Minister). The 5-year-old gelding represents four generations of Strawbridge PA-Breds – his granddam is the stellar racemare Alice Springs, and greatgranddam First Approach was a multiple graded stakes winner by Pennsylvania stallion Northern Fling. Holiday Star came back to finish third in the Red Smith Handicap at Aqueduct on Nov. 14. his fourth stakes performance in his last four starts (accounting for two wins, a second and a third) which boosted his earnings to \$336,019.

Flying Officer, a 5-year-old son of Dynaformer trained by John Gosden in England, won the \$345,000 two-mile British Champions Long Distance Cup-G2 at Ascot Racecourse on Oct. 17. He is the latest major performer for Strawbridge's stakes-winning PA-Bred Diesis (GB) mare Vignette. Two of her earlier foals are Flying Officer's full brothers Lucarno, an English classic winner when he captured the St. Leger Stakes-G1 in 2007, and Group 2 winner Thought Worthy.

Another PA-Bred to win during the stretch was Strawbridge's 5-year-old Kitten's Point (Kitten's Joy—Rendezvous Point, by Kingmambo), who recorded her fourth stakes win of the year in the Grade 3 Dowager Stakes at Keeneland on Oct. 18.

The 3-year-old Canadian-bred colt Lucky Lindy is homebred graded stakes winner number five. He followed a victory in the Ontario Derby-G3 by taking the Hawthorne Derby-G3 for trainer Mark Frostad on Oct. 17 at Hawthorne. The son of Harlan's Holiday is out of the Rahy mare Celebrate, who was also bred in Canada by

Strawbridge.

The most expensive sold on the first night, Hip 200, Tapit's stakes-winning daughter Star Pearl. The 5-year-old mare, carrying her first foal to the cover of Bernardini, was purchased by Crupi's New Castle for \$450,000 from the consignment of Hunter Valley Farm, agent.

Star Pearl was bred by Stephen E. Quick out of his five-time stakes-winning mare Lexi Star (by Crypto Star), an earner of \$605,424 who was also multiple graded stakes placed. Quick sold Star Pearl as a yearling for \$150,000 at Keeneland in September 2011.

Racing for Pearl Bloodstock Ltd., Star Pearl launched her career in England, winning twice, before returning to the U.S. where in short order she got her first stakes win in the Northern Fling Stakes at Presque Isle Downs in July 2014. Trained in the U.S. by Graham Motion, she made her final start this past Jan. 3 in the Nellie Morse Stakes at Laurel Park, and won easily under a hand ride.

The top-priced weanling was HnR Noth-haft Horseracing LLC (Hank Nothhaft)'s dark bay or brown filly by Scat Daddy, sold through the Darby Dan Farm consignment for \$140,000 to Cavalier Bloodstock. The filly is out of Randie's Legend, a daughter of Benchmark whose first foal to race is current two-time winning 3-year-old filly Smarty's Legend. The filly's third dam is Canadian champion Eternal Search.



Blasts From The Past



YANKEE AFFAIR

1982, by Northern Fling—My Malchen, by Debbysman. Bred by Derry Meeting Farm; owned by Ju Ju Gen Stable (Henry L. Carroll, Jay A. Garsman and Martin Scheinman); trained by Henry L. Carroll.

It would be hard to find any other PA-Bred who proved to be more of a bargain than Yankee Affair. Bred by Marshall W. Jenney's Derry Meeting Farm and sold as a yearling at Timonium for \$10,200 to trainer Henry L. Carroll as agent, the son of Pennsylvania stallion Northern Fling earned a grand total of \$2,282,156 during his five seasons on the track and ranked as Pennsylvania's all-time

leading money-earner from 1989 until 1996 when surpassed by Alphabet Soup.

Runner-up (to Steinlen-GB) for an Eclipse Award as champion turf runner in 1989, a season in which he competed at eight different tracks and won three Grade 1 stakes, Yankee Affair won 22 of 55 career starts, and was a graded stakes winner at ages 5, 6, 7 and 8. Among his wins were the Grade 1 Turf Classic and Man o' War Stakes at Belmont and United Nations Handicap at Atlantic City. He won 15 stakes (nine graded), and was second or third in 15 more. Twice he set course records, for a mile at Keeneland and in the King Edward Gold Cup Handicap-G3 at Woodbine in which he equaled the world record for a mile and eighth on the turf when stopping the clock in 1:45.40.

It was 25 years ago when Yankee Affair concluded his career. He made eight starts

his 8-year-old season, all but one a graded stakes, and hit the board in seven of them. In his final start, on Nov. 6, 1990, he finished second to Who's to Pay in the Knickerbocker Stakes-G3 at Aqueduct.

In July 1991, during a workout at Belmont Park, Yankee Affair suffered a hairline fracture in his left front pastern which necessitated surgery. Tragically, while coming out of anesthesia, he fractured his other front leg and was humanely destroyed, denying him the life of retirement waiting for him at Carroll's farm in South Carolina.

Blasts From the Past takes a look back at PA-Breds of distinction throughout history. The majority of the biographies were included in the PHBA's 50th year anniversary commmemmorative booklet, published in 1998.


