Fantasy Lane Stable - Racing for the Common Man

The story of Fantasy Lane Stable cannot be told without including the intertwined tales of three men and one standout horse. Bob Hutt, his father David, and his best friend Alan Seewald all had a hand in the eventual shaping of the Fantasy Lane, which has grown to include 500 partners and 50 horses in the last 16 years. The most tremendous of those was Uptowncharlybrown, who now stands at Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville.

Long before he was involved in racing, Bob Hutt was being shaped by father David, a World War II Master Sergeant who raised his son as he trained his soldiers. "He was a very tough man, and we weren't close," the younger Hutt said. "But it wasn't until I was older when I understood that until you walk in another man's shoes, you don't know what his life is. My father worked three jobs, grew up in the Bronx, and took care of his brother and parents during the Great Depression. He may have been tough on his soldiers but after my kids were born, I saw how much he loved his grandchildren. The last 25 years of our relationship, a son couldn't love his father more than I loved him."

Bob Hutt had started frequenting the racetrack as a 16-year-old; losing with a \$2 show bet is what got him hooked. "When my parents retired, I visited them down in Florida, and I didn't know my father liked racehorses," he recalled. "One day I saw him with a *Daily Racing Form*. It turned out he went every Wednesday and Saturday with his friends as a \$2 bettor."

Hutt soon opened CalHutt Stable, his own private racing stable. The reason was to allow his father and his friends to really enjoy the exciting world of Thoroughbred racing. In

the winter, Hutt would treat everyone to dinner and hand out winner circle photographs. "My father's friends would always tease me, asking when I was going to adopt them. I would always reply the paperwork was being worked on as we all shared a laugh," Hutt said. Seventy horses went through the CalHutt program, and their trainer was Hutt's dearest friend, Alan Seewald.

"Alan and I were best friends, literally," Hutt said. "This wasn't your typical owner/trainer relationship. We were more like brothers, a relationship which lasted 25 years. In all that time we never had a real disagreement. How many people do you know that could ever make that claim?"

In 1999, a year after David Hutt died, Seewald encouraged Hutt to honor his father by starting a stable for the common man; thus, Fantasy Lane Stable was born. "Fantasy Lane Stable is for the blue collar racing fan in which one could invest a few hundred dollars and enjoy all the thrills and excitement of Thoroughbred racing," he said. Hutt told the few Fantasy Lane partners back in 1999 what Alan had taught him, that there were a million ways to lose a race, but only one way to win. Hutt recalls, "Naturally, I was proved a liar as our very first runner won, and the second horse we claimed won his first two starts and became a stakes horse."

Hutt quickly started looking at unraced juveniles, trying to score with a big horse. "We wound up with four stakes horses while buying only a couple of horses a year

all on a modest budget," Hutt said. "Our first really nice horse was R Betty Graybull purchased for just \$60,000."

The Holy Bull filly broke her maiden at Belmont Park in September 2008 by four and a quarter lengths. She wheeled back 20 days later to take the \$200,000 Monmouth Park NATC Futurity, emerging out of the deep fog to win by a neck. She eventually added the Anniron Stakes at Belmont, and the Leecoo Stakes and Ladies Handicap at Aqueduct to her resume, retiring with eight wins in 23 starts and earnings of \$436,117.

Breeding giant Frank Stronach bought a 50 percent interest in the mare, who retired to his Adena Springs in Kentucky. Hutt recently purchased the mare back in foal to Awesome Again, and she has arrived at Diamond B Farm, where the rest of the Fantasy Lane mares are kept. "We call her the 'Diva,'" Hutt said. "She even gets a birthday cake and party hat."

At the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in 2009, Fantasy Lane Stable purchased a strapping son of Limehouse for \$57,000. "Now Alan was never one to brag or say much as he was pretty down to earth," Hutt recalled of Seewald, "but in August 2009, he called one day to say this was the best horse I'd ever owned. I asked how he knew, since the horse hadn't even breezed. Was Alan ever correct!"

The Limehouse colt was Uptowncharlybrown, who stayed in the barn until December 26 of that year. When finally unveiled, he romped home by nine lengths in a Tampa Bay Downs maiden special weight, and immediately vaulted onto many Kentucky Derby watch lists.

Three weeks later, he took the Pasco Stakes by six lengths, pulling away in the lane impressively. "We were offered \$2.5 million, and Alan was never one to turn down money, but he did this time. Alan truly believed he may have been the best 3-year-old in the country."

With an eye on the Belmont Stakes-G1, Seewald pointed Uptowncharlybrown for Keeneland's Lexington Stakes-G2 on April 17, 2010. Just five days before the race, suddenly and unexpectedly, Seewald died. Hutt gave Seewald's eulogy before a crowded chapel of more than a thousand mourners.

A grieving Hutt didn't attend the Lexington, but Uptowncharlybrown fought to the wire despite a slow start and bumpy race. He finished third, beaten only a length and a half. He was transferred to the care of trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, who worked him against what he thought to be the best sophomore in his barn, eventual graded stakes winner Trappe Shot. Uptowncharlybrown outworked him, galloping out way in front.

In the Belmont Stakes, Uptowncharlybrown finished fifth, but was disqualified to last after it was discovered his saddle's weight pad had slipped out during the running

of the race. He was prepping for the Haskell Invitational-G1 when he bowed a tendon, but instead of retirement, the colt was rehabbed to return to the races in 2011. More than a year later, he finished second in a salty allowance, defeated by eventual Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Tapizar but defeating Grade 1 winner Boys At Tosconova.

Uptowncharlybrown ran through early 2012 but was never the same. He retired with two wins, two seconds and two thirds in 13 starts for earnings of \$125,030. He record does not do his ability justice.

The stallion has joined Hutt's mares at Diamond B Farm, which is owned and managed by Glenn and Becky Brok, the husband and wife team who share a passion for racing in Pennsylvania. "They are the salt of the earth, just wonderful people," Hutt said of the Broks.

"Hutt is a good guy with a really good partnership," Glenn Brok said. "He has a lot of loyal people that he's gotten into the sport at an affordable price point, and has allowed a lot of people that are racing enthusiasts to participate at a level where they can afford it but still feel like it's their horse."

Brok credits Hutt's marketing skills for what could be one of the better stallion deals in the sport: Uptowncharlybrown's \$1,500 stud fee is only due if the foal ends up winning a race. "You can't have a deal better than that," Brok said. "They are supporting the horse very well." Uptowncharlybrown and all the Diamond B Farms horses will be available for inspection at the annual open house on Jan. 9.

To get involved in Fantasy Lane Stable all it takes is a phone call to Hutt. "Everything in Fantasy Lane has been word of mouth, I rarely ever advertise," he said. "We've gone from 10 partners to 500. I often laugh as I remember that Alan told me it wouldn't be any work, but he turned Fantasy Lane into a full time job for me. This is truly a labor of love.

"Uptowncharlybrown's first crop of 2-year-olds hit the racetrack next summer. He has really stamped his mark on his progeny as all are handsome, athletic, with a great way of moving. All are prepping this winter down in Ocala, Florida getting ready for their debut. Uptowncharlybrown's juveniles are and will be Alan's legacy." ★

PA-Breds score big in home state

PA-BREDS SWEEP PENN NATIONAL HOLIDAY FESTIVAL STAKES

Three stakes were up for grabs on the popular Thanksgiving Eve program at Penn National on Nov. 25. The evening featured the \$200,000 Fabulous Strike Handicap for 3 and up at six furlongs, named for the Pennsylvania-bred millionaire sprinter who got his first win at the track in 2006; the \$100,000 Swatara Stakes for older runners at a mile and a sixteenth; and the \$75,000 Blue Mountain Juvenile Fillies Stakes for 2-year-old state-breds. Three overwhelming favorites won, and all three are PA-Breds.

The shortest price of the night was Behrnik's Bank, making only her second start in the Blue Mountain Juvenile Fillies. Sent off at 1-5 in the field of seven, Peter Kazamias' dark bay homebred by his own stallion Bank Heist destroyed the field in her debut three weeks earlier at Penn, drawing off to win by 18½ lengths while getting six furlongs in 1:09.64 while totally overlooked at 14-1. Her effort in her stakes debut was even more sensational.

The outcome was never in doubt from the start. With Edwin Gonzalez in the irons, Behrnik's Bank cruised to the front through an opening quarter in :22.36, went the half in :44.95 while on top by 10 lengths, then galloped home the easiest of winners by 13 lengths. Her final time was 1:10.22 for the six furlongs, .78 of a second faster than the final time of the Fabulous Strike Handicap two races later. The effort earned Behrnik's Bank a 94 Beyer Speed Figure, the fifth highest of all juveniles who ran in 2015.

Behrnik's Bank is the fourth winner from as many foals for the Chimes Band mare Behrnik, and her first stakes winner. Behrnik's Bank is also the first runner from the first crop of Bank Heist, a half-brother (by Maria's Mon) to champion sprinter Midnight Lute who stands at Kaz Hill Farm in Middletown, N.Y.



The second stakes on the card, run as the third race, was won by one of the most consistent older runners of 2015, Page McKenney. Making his 10th start of the year—and never worse than third while competing exclusively in stakes company—he held off Belmont shipper Kid Cruz to win the Swatara by a half length, while giving the runner-up four pounds.

It was Page McKenney's second stakes win in a row, after taking Laurel Park's Richard W. Small Stakes 11 days earlier. Bred by Dr. James E. Bryant and Linda P. Davis, owned by Adam Staple and Jalin Stable and trained by Mary Eppler, Page McKenney had his best season yet in 2015 at age 5, earning \$589,900, and the son of former Pennsylvania stallion Eavesdropper pushed his total ever closer to the million-dollar mark, needing \$23,022 to reach the milestone.

The most contentious race figured to be the Fabulous Strike, which attracted a stellar group of sprinters, including Ben's Cat, the only winner of the race seeking his fourth title.

Favorite Tale came into the race with the strongest credentials, having run in graded company throughout the year, with a win in Gulfstream Park's Smile Sprint Stakes-G2, which earned him an automatic berth in the Breeders' Cup Sprint-G1, and thirds in the Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap-G1 at Saratoga, as well as the Breeders' Cup Sprint-G1, his last start before coming back to Pennsylvania.

Bettors made Favorite Tale the 1-2 favorite and he ran like an overwhelming favorite. Applying tactics that have earned him eight wins in 18 lifetime starts, the son of Tale of the City shot to the lead under Javier Castellano, posting splits of :22.05, :45.19 and :57.80, and had more than enough left to win by two lengths in 1:11 flat while carrying top weight of 124 in the field of eight. The Guadalupe Preciado trainee, campaigned by his breeder Paul Conaway in the name of PJG Stable, recorded three wins, a second and a third in seven starts in 2015, earning \$510,700 of his lifetime total \$891,026.

PENNSYLVANIA NURSERY: A BREAKOUT PERFORMANCE FOR BIRD OF TREY

It seemed only a matter of time before JRitaYoung Thoroughbreds LLC's Bird of Trey would get his first stakes win. He looked special when he broke his maiden in his second start, scoring by 11 lengths at five furlongs on the main track at Parx in September. Three weeks later trainer John Servis sent him out against open company in Parx's Hall of Fame Stakes. Lacking room at critical times he still fought hard and missed by a length to finish second.

In October, he faced stakes-performer Morning Fire in allowance company. It was the first time he really gave way in a race as he finished second, nearly three lengths behind Morning Fire. But the effort didn't deter his followers.

The \$100,000 Pennsylvania Nursery Stakes, the final state-bred stakes on the 2015 calendar run at Parx on Dec. 5, proved the turning point. Made the favorite among 10 juvenile colts and geldings, he battled second-choice Morning Fire through the opening quarter, eased back after the half and then charged past and was clear at the top of the stretch. From there it was cruise control for Joshua Navarro as the bay colt won by seven and a quarter lengths over Morning Fire.

A son of Belmont Stakes winner Birdstone, Bird of Trey is the first foal out of Take Me Home Too, a daughter of Came Home who was also a stakes winner for Arkansas-based JRitaYoung Thoroughbreds. He has earned \$146,748 with five on-the-board finishes in five starts. ★

The 2-year-old stakes at Penn National and Parx, which were the last of the year for PA-Breds, were super exciting. The fillie's race at Penn was won very convincingly by Behrnik's Bank. This was only her second start after breaking her maiden in a special weight by 18 lengths. Rumors that her owner Peter Kazamias turned down \$650,000 before the race could be heard at the track. Someone else mentioned that she could be another Princess of Sylmar. We won't know about that for a little while, but it's sure great to be able to cross our fingers and hope for another great PA-Bred.

The boy's race at Parx came down to another clash between Morning Fire and Bird of Trey, which is named after the grandson of JRita Young Thoroughbred's Trey. In their previous two meetings, the Cindy Hipple-bred Morning Fire came out on top, but that was not the case in the Nursery. The John Servis-trained Bird of Trey came off the turn in full stride and would draw clear to win by 7¼ lengths. Trey was represented in the winner's circle by a cardboard cutout held by his grandmother Rita.

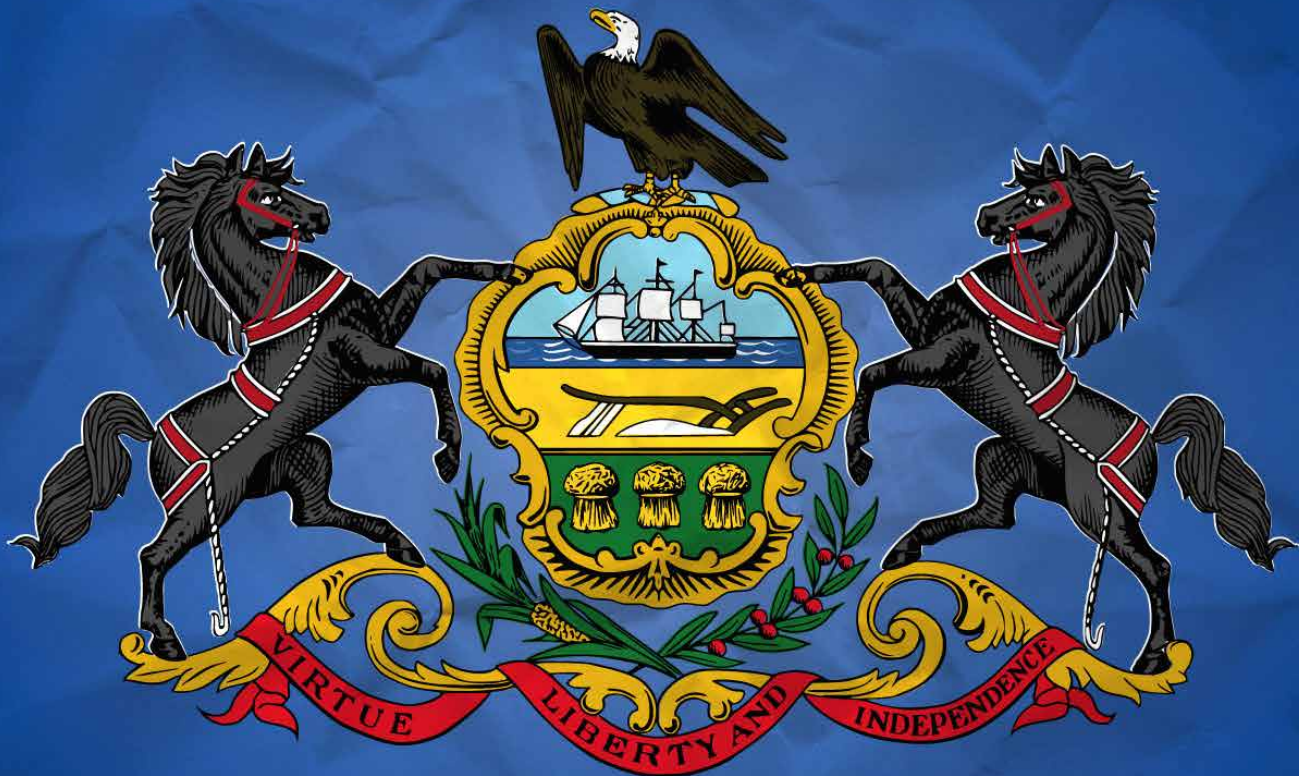

A genuine working-class hero, PA-Bred Curribot was the oldest Thoroughbred runner competing in North America when he retired in 1991. Bred by Mrs. J.O. Burgwin, Curribot campaigned 12 seasons, made 139 starts, had 37 wins, 20 seconds and 20 thirds and earned \$491,527. He won 22 stakes—his last at age 11—and remains the all-time leader among state-bred runners by number of stakes wins.

Curribot launched his career on the East Coast, but became a legend in the Southwest. He never started in his home state, the closest when making three consecutive starts at Atlantic City in the summer of 1981. Those efforts were part of a 12-start losing streak from April 1981 through February 1982, the last



attempt coming at Fair Grounds. When he re-appeared 14 months later, he was at Sunland Park recording an allowance win. Next out, he won his first stakes race, appropriately named the Inaugural Handicap, at Ruidoso Downs. He would never start east of the Mississippi again.

Known in New Mexico as “The Chairman,” Curribot loved the Southwest. He won five consecutive runnings of the Sunland Park Handicap and in his final attempt in 1989 finished second. He still holds the track record for a mile and a quarter at Sunland.

In his final career start, in September 1991 at Albuquerque for a \$2,500 tag, he was claimed by John Bachechi, who wanted the gelding to have a good home for the rest of his life. Curribot lived 11 more years, and was euthanized at age 25 at Clements Ranch in New Mexico.

Sunland Park recognizes Curribot with a stakes run in his honor each year.

Blasts From the Past takes a look back at PA-Breds of distinction throughout history. The majority of the biographies were included in the PHBA's 50th year anniversary commemorative booklet, published in 1998.
