The Tide Has Turned For Page McKenney

Harriet Beecher Stowe once proclaimed, "When you get into a tight place and everything goes against you, till it seems as though you could not hang on a minute longer, never give up then, for that is just the place and time that the tide will turn." The story of a Pennsylvania-bred

gelding named Page McKenney indeed proves that you should never give up on a dream. The handsome chestnut was consistent in his early career—consistently inconsistent.

His juvenile year as a racehorse began with a sixth-place finish at Colonial Downs where he was beaten by double-digit lengths. Owner Jalin Stable and trainer Jazz Napravnik then tried races at Saratoga Race Course and Laurel Park, none of which were successful. However, while at first glance a ninth-place finish in Maryland may look like a wash, it was the beginning of a learning experience for Page McKenney. He had finally started to show some speed, running along the rail only 2 lengths off the leaders before faltering in the stretch.

Four unsuccessful races to open his career meant that it was time for a drop in class, so his connections ran him for a claiming tag of \$16,000 at Laurel. This time, not only was he able

to keep up but he also prompted the pace throughout, en route to his very first career finish on the board.

Two more starts that year brought his record to a second and a third from seven

starts. It would have been understandable for his connections to throw in the towel, but this is a story about never giving up.

His first few starts of 2013 were varied in distance, surface and results: a promising second-place finish followed by disappointment while sprinting on the dirt at

Laurel, then another fast-closing second at Penn National. One month later, he was off the board again while stretching out to a mile. Finally his connections tried a 1½6-mile turf race at Pimlico on Kentucky Derby

day, where he ran evenly before closing late to pass tiring competitors but was again off the board.

In his next start at Colonial Downs, the tide began to change for Page McKenney as he broke on top and high-tailed it to the lead, then drew off down the stretch

to finally break his maiden by three emphatic lengths. It was his lucky 13th start and one of the last for his original connections. He was claimed for \$16,000 at Penn National one month later.

Making his first start for new owner Adam Staple and trainer Mary Eppler, Page McKenney contested a 1½6-mile allowance race on the turf at Penn National, exhibiting tactical speed early before making a late bid en route to a second-place finish and showing promise under the care of his new barn.

On Sept. 25, 2013, he partnered with top jockey Horacio Karamanos for the first time. It was a winning combination as the duo stalked the pace off the leaders and then dug in gamely approaching the wire, responding to heavy urging by his rider and holding off a late closer by a head.

After that tenacious victory, Staple received a phone call from Dr. James Bryant of Jalin Stable, who was in-

terested in buying back part ownership of their homebred. It was a difficult decision, but Staple decided to let them join him as a minority owner. It turned out to be a brilliant move for Jalin Stable.

Eppler stepped Page McKenney up in class for his next race, a starter allowance on the turf at Laurel Park. Again partnering with Karamanos, they blew up the tote board by paying \$39.60 to win. Despite stumbling at the start, his speed quickly carried him up to the leaders, where he bided his time before taking over at the eighth pole and holding off the late-closing Grain to win by a half length.

Page McKenney closed out his sophomore season with two more in-the-money starts at Laurel, bringing his 2013 total earnings to an astounding 10 times more than the \$7,548 he had earned as a juvenile. Clearly, as Harriet Beecher Stowe predicted, when you hang on long enough, the tide will turn in your favor.

Since then, the Page McKenney team has been handsomely rewarded, even while steadily stepping him up in class. Also occasionally joining the team is two-time leading Parx Racing jockey Frankie Pennington. Karamanos and Pennington have split riding duties and both get along perfectly with the gelding. The former has six total victories with the gelding, while the latter boasts three wins including a track record-setting performance at Parx last July 7.

Pennington loves when he has the opportunity to hop aboard Page McKenney. "He's an all-around class horse who loves his job and always tries 100%. He just never gives up and has a great trainer who really knows him," he says.

Last August, Karamanos and Page McKenney captured their first stakes victory together at Penn National in the \$90,000 Robellino Stakes for PA-Breds, defeating graded stakes winner Edge of Reality by 1¾ lengths. Two starts later, Pennington guided the gelding to his second stakes win in the \$75,000 First Responder Stakes. Page McKenney also boasts stakes-placings in the \$100,000 Alphabet Soup Handicap for PA-Breds, \$130,000 Mountaineer Mile, \$100,000 Richard W. Small Stakes, and closed out 2014 with a second-place finish in the \$200,000 Claiming Crown Jewel Stakes at Gulfstream Park.

This year, the PA-Bred has been even better. In the John B. Campbell Handicap on Valentine's Day at his Laurel Park home base, Page McKenney was pinned behind horses going around the far turn and was forced to swing five-wide under Karamanos, then closed tenaciously between horses

and got up to win by a hard-fought neck. A second victory in the Harrison E. Johnson Memorial Stakes by 4 lengths at Laurel on March 21 stamped his ticket to the \$1.5 million Charles Town Classic-G2 on April 18.

In the most difficult race of his career, he faced the earners of nearly \$10 million, including superstar Shared Belief, Whitney Handicap-G1 winner Moreno and Charles Town Classic defending champ Imperative. Page McKenney had every excuse to fail, but that's something he just doesn't do anymore. He overcame being carried wide on each of the three tight turns and closed courageously to capture third place behind the new track record-setter Moreno.

The best part of the story is that he is just coming into his own. According to Eppler, "He's just so consistent. I can't tell you why he's consistent but he just is."

One thing is for sure with the story of the flashy chestnut Pennsylvania-bred gelding: never give up when rough waves start pushing you out to sea. The team of Page McKenney followed their tide, came roaring back to shore and is on the way to a successful season in 2015.



Blasts From The Past

IROQUOIS

1878, *Leamington— Maggie B. B., by *Australian. Bred by Aristides Welch; owned by Pierre Lorillard IV; trained by Jacob Pincus. Foaled at Erdenheim Stud.

1881 Epsom Derby winner

Iroquois stands alone among the giants of horse racing as the only one whose victory—in the 1881 English Derby—caused trading on Wall Street to be suspended. The horse who stopped Wall Street was foaled at Erdenheim Stud in Chestnut Hill, Pa. His breeder Aristides Welch sold him in a package of yearlings to tobacco baron Pierre Lorillard, who raced the colt to international acclaim.

What the brown son of *Leamington— Maggie B. B., by *Australian, accomplished in his 3-year-old season is almost beyond belief. His victory in the June 1 Epsom Derby was preceded by three challenging, closely spaced performances: a second in the Two Thousand Guineas (May 4) and victories in the (May 6) Newmarket Stakes and (May 7) Burwell Stakes at Newmarket. Two weeks after the Epsom Derby, he came back to win the St. James Palace Stakes (carrying 131 pounds). After a three-month break, he won the Doncaster St. Leger. In October, he was third in the (mile and a quarter) Champion Stakes behind Bend Or, winner of the 1880 Derby. The next day—after being blanketed for "sweating gallop" after his connections deemed he had not gotten enough out of the Champion Stakes - Iroquois was sent to the post for the mile and a half Newmarket Derby. He won. Unraced at 4, he campaigned successfully, although less spectacularly, at 5, then was brought back to stand at stud at Lorillard's Rancocas Farm in New Jersey.



The euphoria that surrounded Iroquois' English Derby has likely not been experienced by present-day horsemen, even those who remember such stirring events as Secretariat's Belmont Stakes win. Turf writers penned eloquent poems in his honor. Men toasted Iroquois in hotels and sporting clubs. Some among the disenchanted British sniffed that Iroquois was, in fact, very nearly English-bred, being by an imported stallion and out of a mare whose sire was also imported. Still, circumstance dictated

the Iroquois be foaled in Pennsylvania – and go on to become the standard-bearer for an entire nation.

Blasts From the Past takes a look back at Pennsylvania-breds of distinction throughout history. The majority of the biographies were included in the PHBA's 50th year anniversary commemorative booklet. published in 1998.



Pennsylvania News Briefs

\$700,000 PA-Bred juvenile at OBS Sales

Repole Stable went \$700,000 to secure a PA-Bred colt by Blame out of PA-Bred stakes winner Alexandra Rylee at the Ocala Breeders' Sales spring 2-year-olds in training sale. The price equalled the top for the third session on Thursday, April 23, and was equal to the fourth-highest price of the sale overall.

Bred by The Elkstone Group LLC, the May 16 foal was initially sold at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale for \$105,000. Consigned by All In Sales (Tony Bowling) at the Ocala sale, the colt worked an eighth in :10.20.



The Blame colt is the second foal out of Alexandra Rylee, a daughter of Afleet Alex who won three of her five starts, including the Brandywine Stakes in 2010. Alexandra Rylee was purchased by The Elkstone Group for \$275,000 while carrying her first foal at the Keeneland January All Ages sale in 2012. That foal, a daughter of Tapit named Wifeinthefastlane in training for her breeder, has yet to win after making her debut in March.

Pennsylvania stallions leading the way

Through early May, the top four spots on the Mid-Atlantic sires rankings are held by Pennsylvania stallions. The late Rockport Harbor leads by earnings with \$1,529,631, followed by Jump Start, Smarty Jones and Corinthian.

Six stallions have stakes winners this year, with Jump Start leading the way with three, represented by multiple Group 3 winner Seresta in Argentina; millionaire Pants On Fire, winner of the Sir Shackleton Stakes at Gulfstream Park in March and in his most recent start third in the Churchill Downs Stakes-G2 at Churchill Downs on Derby Day; and Interborough Stakes winner

Willet.

Rockport Harbor is the sire of two stakes winners, led by Weast Hill, winner of the Oaklawn Park's Rainbow Stakes in his second career start.

Smarty Jones has five stakes performers, including graded runners Old Time Hockey, Smart D N A and Nasa.

Others stakes-winning sires to date this year are Power by Far (Power of Snunner), Weigelia (Brenda's Way) and Wheaton (Russell Road).

PA-Breds at FT Midlantic May sale

A total of 37 PA-Bred juveniles have been catalogued for the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, which kicks off at 10 a.m. on Monday and Tuesday, May 18 and May 19, at the sales pavilion in Timonium, Md. The Under Tack Show begins at 8 a.m. on Wednesday, May 13 and Thursday, May 14.

Pennsylvania sires represented are Corinthian, Fairbanks, Jump Start, Talent Search and Weigelia, as well as the late Love of Money, Silver Train and Wiseman's Ferry. There are PA-Breds by E Dubai and Flashy Bull who formerly stood in the state.

Stakes Schedule for PA-Breds Offers \$1.75 Million in 2015



The first PA-Bred stakes of the year were run on the first Saturday in May at Parx and went to consistent runners recording their first career stakes wins.

First up was Briardale Stable's A Fleet Attitude in the \$75,000 Lyman Handicap. A 5-year-old son of champion Afleet Alex bred Charles Zacney and Tim Ritchey, A Fleet Attitude was making his first start of the year. Overlooked at 6.60-1 as the fifth choice in the field of 11 despite a record of 16 topthree finishes in 18 career starts, the chestnut gelding bided his time off a guick pace set by Kobel, rallied five-wide and ran down the frontrunners to finish in a thrilling threeway photo, getting up to win by a head, with Kobel second and Yougotthatgoinforu a nose back in third. It was the fifth win Richard Vega trainee, in his first stakes attempt since finishing in a deadheat for second in the 2013 Crowd Pleaser Handicap.

Power of Snunner had a much easier time in the \$75,000 Foxy J. G. Stakes, drawing off to win by more than four lengths. The daughter of Power by Far (who is a grandson of the race's namesake), went off as favorite of the 10 starters, and came into the race off a scintillating 10½-length score in allowance company in April.

Bred and owned by James M. Courtney and trained by Tim Kreiser, Power of Snunner recorded her sixth win, to go with nine seconds and two thirds, in her 19-start career. The 5-year-old mare had twice come close to capturing stakes earlier in her career—missing by a neck in both the Silver Train HBPA and Dr. Teresa Garofalo Memorial Stakes at 3.
