Wheelers' family affair thrives at WynOaks

A family partnership that began 15 years ago with the purchase of a timeworn Delta, Pa., property has grown into WynOaks Farm, a leading breeding and foaling operation managed by Chip and Barbara Wheeler.

The Wheelers partnered with Chip's mother and step-father Susan and Stephen Quick who had built their own farm in Forest Hill, Md., in the mid 1970s. Twelve miles apart and across state lines it is an easy commute between homes and businesses for the family that works together.

The Quicks purchased their own farm to house ponies owned by then teenagers Chip and his older sister Suzanne. "I was not really into horses at all," said Susan. "I had just remarried, had two children, a husband and a farm that I knew nothing about."

Stephen turned the farm from a hobby into a full-time responsibility after retiring from the building industry. Deciding to buy a broodmare, he delved into the science of Thoroughbred pedigrees and breeding. With the blessing of beginner's luck their first purchase was a barren Virginia-bred daughter of First Landing named Pilgrim's Pride who they bred in 1978.

"At the time, everyone wanted to breed to Northern Dancer but we knew we couldn't do that," said Susan. "So we bred her to North Sea [both Northern Dancer and North Sea sons of Nearctic] and the result was Kattegat's Pride."

Kattegat's Pride became a graded stakes winner and three-time Maryland-bred champion who won 19 of 54 starts and \$511,812, and when bred to Spend a Buck produced her one and only filly, named Kattebuck, in 1988. A winner

herself, Kattebuck produced millionaire and two-time Maryland-bred champion Silmaril, a daughter of Diamond. The Quicks had firmly supported the Maryland-bred program but it was difficult to ignore what was beginning to happen in Pennsylvania with the state's lucrative bonuses to PA-Breds.

"My mother-in-law is a die-hard Marylander," said Barbara. "She and Stephen had a great run breeding and racing there for over 30 years but as the Pennsylvania breeders bonuses came through, she noticed. Almost all of their foals are born in Pennsylvania at WynOaks now."



The Quicks' success with their small band of fillies inspired the name for their new venture in Pennsylvania. "It is kind of a play on words," said Barbara. "We love the fillies and of course we'd love to someday win the Oaks with one of them so therefore, the Pennsylvania farm became WynOaks."

The WynOaks property originally held one house and lots of grassy pasture although no horses had been living there for years. The Wheelers expanded the 97 acres with a 60-acre buffer zone purchased from PECO to keep the hunters at bay, and a new barn allowed for equine residents other than their own small band of mares.

Barbara and Chip met 30 years ago while working for a liquor distributor when she was 19. Soon after they moved to the

Quicks' farm in Maryland. While Chip currently handles the physical part of the farm life at WynOaks, his wife is the organizer and also juggles a job 30 minutes away in purchasing at the U.S. Army's Proving Ground in Aberdeen, Md. "Barbara had never been involved with horses before we met," said Chip. "But she was kind of forced into this lifestyle and has a very good business mind for it."

"When I was 20 I was exposed to farm life for the first time in Maryland at the Quicks' home where Chip was raised," said Barbara. "For the first seven years we managed WynOaks we did most of the work ourselves in order to cut costs and get things going. Foaling season from January through mid-June this year is the only time I get physically involved going down to the barn and helping with the babies and mares. Otherwise I deal with all of the paperwork for our

client base so I know everything involved with the breeding and registering of the foals is getting kept up to date."

The existing small barn on their property worked well for their own band of mares, but when clients like leading owner and breeder Tom McClay came aboard with his broodmares the research began to design and build a larger, better barn.

Gathering ideas for the new structure the Wheelers travelled to Kentucky and returned ready to begin hiring a group of Amish men as builders. "They are very quiet, hardworking people," said Barbara. "They were clean and tidy on the job site and built us a beautiful 28-stall barn with

large foaling stalls in which we installed cameras.”

Within a year the Wheelers were visited by Bernie and Betsy Houghton. “They came to visit with my in-laws and were very open in helping us understand the PA breeding industry. They were on the same track as we are: breeding their own sound, sturdy horses. Bernie told us not to worry about selling our homebreds but to worry about their handling after investing so much into each of them.”

Aside from her business savvy Barbara takes on a great public relations role in speaking about the farm’s investment six years ago in multiple stakes-winning millionaire Weigelia as the farm’s first stallion.

“Weigelia stood his first season at stud for us in 2009,” said Barbara. “He was owned by former client Joe Balsamo who retired him sound after racing. Ed Price brokered the deal and when we went to see the horse down in Florida we expected to see a tired out racehorse but here he was out on the lead shank on his two hind feet.”

“Conformationally he is perfect,” said Chip. “He was too much to handle for the people caring for him in Florida since he had been mostly in a stall after his retirement.

We bought him, took him home to WynOaks and gave him a job breeding mares. He’s not mean at all but he is active and looks more like a very fit horse rather than a retired horse.”

“We had been to breeding sheds all over and had seen some very aggressive stallions,” said Barbara. “We were a little shy about standing our own but Weigelia is a perfect gentleman. He actually lives in the barn where the mares live, none immediately surrounding him of course. We were hugely lucky that way as he is good in the breeding shed, is very fertile and we rarely have to breed him twice.”

Her conversation about the WynOaks breeding plan is peppered with the word “durability,” which is what WynOaks looks for in broodmares for their stallion. For example, Stephen Quick purchased the 7-year-old Housebuster mare Polar Miss for \$1,000 in a 2006 mixed sale. Her daughter and Weigelia’s second-highest earner (\$287,983) is Isabella Swift, who is currently racing at the age of 5.

“We’ve hoping to get him more attention—he consistently gets a dozen outside mares plus our own little band, and we’ve

had stronger interest this year with people noticing his 2015 stakes winner, Brenda’s Way, who was also his first winner [and is his leading earner].”

The Wheelers eventually sent two of Weigelia’s offspring to the Houghtons to train. “We really admire Bernie as a trainer,” said Barbara. “They could not be better people. They actually bred to our stallion this year after Bernie took notice of some of Weigelia’s foals that he ended up racing against.”

Certainly the eight-time stakes-winning son of Safely’s Mark, now 14 years old, has proven his mettle versus those more fashionably bred in Pennsylvania by finishing sixth in total stallion awards in 2014.

WynOaks is a full-time 24-hour operation located about an hour from Penn National where the Wheeler/Quick family is looking forward to watching Weigelia’s newest crop take to the track this season. No longer the result of “beginner’s luck,” the combined success of both families is the result of hard work, devotion and a thriving Pennsylvania breeding program. ❁

Favorite Tale's Summit of Speed

A win, and he's in! PJG Stable's Favorite Tale got his first win in more than nine months with a commanding four and a quarter-length victory in the \$250,000 Smile Sprint Stakes-G2 at Gulfstream Park on the July 5 Summit of Speed program. The win had an added bonus—it's a Breeders' Cup Win & You're In event.

Favorite Tale's fees and expenses are now paid for a trip to the \$1.5 million Breeders' Cup Sprint-G1 to be held at Keeneland Oct. 31. The big score came at the expense of last year's Eclipse Award-winning sprinter and defending Breeders' Cup Sprint champion Work All Week.

Sent out by trainer Guadalupe Preciado, Favorite Tale turned in a patented frontrunning effort—shooting out of the gate, setting all fractions and blasting home to the finish. He completed six furlongs in 1:08.85 after clocking a quarter in :21.84, the half in :44.09 and five furlongs in :55.98.

"It was great. I sent him all the way until I got the lead, and he's a horse that once it gets a lead he will keep on going," said rider Edgard Zayas. "[Preciado] just told me to have a good break and to extend the lead. Today was a special day."

"We hoped he could run a good race here, because last year the owners wanted to go to the Breeders' Cup, but he's not eligible and it costs a lot of money," Preciado commented to the media after the race. "I told them let's wait a year because hopefully he could win a race and get in. So this was perfect."

The 2014 PA-Bred champion 3-year-old male, Favorite Tale won five races last year, topped by a dazzling performance in the Grade 3 Gallant Bob Stakes at Parx in September. The sprint specialist also came within a fifth of a second off the track record when breaking his maiden at Parx that January, getting six furlongs in 1:07.66, and won Belmont Park's Gold Fever Stakes, his fourth win in his first five starts.

Preciado gave Favorite Tale the winter off after he was fifth, beaten four lengths, in the Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash in November. The Parx-based shipper's return this year came at Monmouth in May in the Decathlon Stakes, but he never got closer than a length of the leader and finished second. He took the lead next out in the True North Stakes at Belmont Park but had to rush to get there after stumbling at the start and failed to last.

Said Preciado: "He's been training beautiful. For this race, he was doing unbelievable and you couldn't ask him to go better than the way he did it.

"We gave him all winter off. He's a gelding and hopefully we keep him running for a few years."

A son of Tale of the Cat out of Tricky Elaine (by Grindstone), a half-sister to 1997 Horse of the Year Favorite Trick, Favorite Tale has a record of six wins from 14 starts, with three seconds and a third, for earnings of \$551,626.

Preciado told Gulfstream Park's media relations department he wasn't sure where Favorite Tale would race next, but it's not expected that he will meet Work All Week in the immediate future.

"We wanted to win one to get into the Breeders' Cup. Now we need to figure out how to get there," noted the trainer. "We have easier races for him now at Parx because he's PA-bred. It's not big money but we can keep him in good shape. We don't need to kill him against the big horses before the big race." ❁

POSITIVE STEP FOR BREEDING AND RACING IN PENNSYLVANIA

The PTHA Horsemen recently negotiated a new racing schedule with PARX. The balance of 2015 and the projected 2016 race dates have been posted. The highlight of 2015 will be an eight-week "Fall Festival" during which time the daily purses will average \$500k and the PA-Bred restricted race purses will be huge! The MSW purse will be \$60k, the 12.5 N2 \$35k, the A1x \$70k and the A2x \$74k.

As a breeder and owner myself I can't wait for the Fall Festival to begin. To sum it up in a word from one of the state's premier breeders Rick Abbott, "WOW!" Another breeder Greg Newell exclaimed, "Did you ever think we would be racing for that kind of money?" The PA Stakes will also be raised to \$100k. PA-Breds will still have

preference and purses for the balance of the year will remain as usual.

During the seven-week period after Christmas until February 13 you will have the option to give your horses a little rest which is probably long overdue, or you can run at Penn National. Sam Elliott, director of racing at PARX, has promised that you will not lose stalls during this break. Over the last couple of years many race cards have been cancelled due to inclement weather and safety conditions. If you decide to continue training the PTHA has made sure the track will remain open and properly maintained.

This is a win-win situation for all involved. Thanks goes out to the PTHA and PARX for putting this all together.

Tonasah: PA-Bred "Rising Star"

Hopes were high when the beautiful 2-year-old filly Tonasah stepped out on the track for the Astoria Stakes at Belmont Park on Belmont Stakes Festival Thursday, June 4, with the public making the Todd A. Pletcher trainee one of the favorites even though it was her first start. But what became memorable was her jaunt around the track eluding captors after dumping Javier Castellano in the post parade and delaying the race about 10 minutes.

Luckily Tonasah returned to the barn unscathed and finally made her first official start on July 2 at Belmont. Sent off as the 4-5 favorite in the field of eight, she was a perfect lady as she burst away from the gate, opened a daylight lead and cruised home a five and

a half-length winner in the five-furlong maiden special weight worth \$75,000.

Bred by Smart Angle LLP, who sold her as a weaning at Keeneland in November 2013 for \$170,000, Tonasah was resold at Keeneland as a yearling for \$250,000 to Starlight. By Malibu Moon out of Quannah County, by Valid Expectations, she is a half-sister to graded stakes winner and current Penn National track record holder Quantum Miss, and campaigns for StarLadies Racing.

Tonasah was singled out by Thoroughbred Daily News as a "TDN Rising Star." Since 2004, TDN has spotlighted nine PA-breds as a "Rising Star" including Granny's Kitten, Favorite Tale, Dame Dorothy and Darwin.

Stakes Schedule for PA-Breds Offers \$1.825 Million in 2015



Danzig Stakes

The 3-year-old Smarty Jones' gelding Amplified didn't make his first career start until May 17, a Parx Racing maiden special Weight which he won in workmanlike fashion.

Start number two was a big step up for, as trainer Brandon Kulp sent him out in stakes competition for the six-furlong Danzig Stakes for 3-year-old PA-Breds at Penn National June 12. And the result was even easier.

Sent off as the 6-1 fourth choice in the field of seven, Amplified was quick away, led at every call, and drew off to an impressive six-length score over favored Instructor Kuno. His final time was a sensational 1:09.35.

Bred and owned by Thomas McClay, Amplified is a member of the first PA-sired crop for Smarty Jones. His dam, stakes-placed Queens Point (by Pyramid Peak) has two older foals, both winners, but Amplified is her first stakes performer.

Amplified returned to the track on July 5 at Parx to face older runners for the first time, and tackle a distance of more than a mile. After dueling for the lead early, he tired to finish fourth.

In three career starts, the chestnut gelding has two wins and earnings of \$84,540.

Smarty Jones sired 43 foals in his 2012 crop, and to date 25 have started and 10 are winners. The same crop has yielded stakes winner and graded stakes-place Nasa. With his second PA-sired crop, Smarty Jones currently ranks as the leading PA 2-year-old sire, with two winners from three starters.

Danzig S. at PEN

Amplified, a member of Smarty Jones' first PA-sired crop, made his stakes debut in the Danzig Stakes for 3-year-olds, his second career start, and won easily after leading at every call.

Lindsay Scott and Jane MacElree bred the filly from the Notebook mare Bumble Bee Mama. From the family of Grade 1-winning millionaire Judy the Beauty and Grade 1 winner In the Gold, Bumble Bee Mama had earlier produced graded stakes-placed Buzzin and Dreamin.

The 2013 foal out of Bumble Bee Mama, a colt by Majestic Warrior also bred by Scott and MacElree, sold for \$240,000 at last fall's Keeneland September Yearling sale.

Capar Girl, a \$25,000 Keeneland September sales yearling, has earned \$165,442 from her 11 starts.

Bumble Bee Mama delivered a colt by Broken Vow in late May 2014, and was not bred back for this year.



New Start S. at PEN

The consistent filly Capar Girl stepped up to stakes company and got her first stakes victory in the New Start Stakes for owner Tom McClay and trainer Bernie Houghton.

New Start Stakes

The first race on the June 12 card at Penn National was the New Start Stakes for PA-Bred 3-year-old fillies. Owner Tom McClay got his first of two stakes wins on the night when Capar Girl, part of the favored even-money entry with Kazuri, rallied wide around the far turn, drove past dueling leaders C R S Angels and Elzebug Cat and drew clear to win by two lengths, recording her first stakes win in her stakes debut. She completed the six furlongs in 1:10.62.

Trained by Bernie Houghton, the bay daughter of Munnings had won two of her previous three starts, both at Penn National in allowance company and had already proven extremely consistent, finishing in the top three in eight of her 10 prior starts.

1985, *Con Man*—*Winnie's Double*, by *Double Edge Sword*. Bred by Ray L. and Louise Brandt; owned by Our Farm Inc.; trained by Ernest M. Cranfield.

All-time winningest PA-Bred

How appropriate that the winningest PA-Bred was named Win Man. Bred by Louise Brandt, of York, the Con Man gelding won 48 of 178 starts over a nine-year span racing exclusively in claimers, handicaps or starter handicaps, with all but nine of his starts coming at Philadelphia Park or Penn National. Also registering 38 seconds and 23 thirds, he was twice honored as claimer of the year and retired with earnings of \$418,689.

When the bay came to the races, making his first start at 2 in September 1987, few would have anticipated what was to come. Win Man was winless in his first dozen starts,

finally breaking through with a maiden claiming win at Penn National in April 1988. But the wins began to add up for the durable gelding, who made 20 or more starts a season for five consecutive years, from 1988 to 1992. He won 10 races at age 5 from 29 starts; his win percentage was even higher during his 9-year-old season as he won 11 of 16. And in his final year of competition as a 10-year-old in 1995, he won six times and placed in another six from 17 starts.

Win Man is a member of Parx Racing's Hall of Fame.

Blasts From the Past takes a look back at Pennsylvania-breds of distinction throughout history. The majority of the biographies were included in the PHBA's 50th year anniversary commemorative booklet, published in 1998.
